



Understanding and Connecting to Adult Services Supported Employment and Day Support Services Training and Transition Services

The transition from school to adult life can feel overwhelming as you begin to navigate the world of adult services with the ultimate goal of living a meaningful, connected, and productive life. There are many different organizations that can provide support to make this possible. This resource provides contact information on a variety of different organizations that provide training, transition, day, and employment supports. Employment Service Organizations are often referred to as “vendors” or “providers”, and many include Day Support or Community Integration Services.

As you and your young adult plan for the future, think about the young adult’s interests, talents and skills along with the support he or she needs to be successful. Consider conducting informational interviews with service providers you think may be a good fit.

What is Employment First?

Employment First is a national movement that supports the philosophy that all people with disabilities are capable of competitive, integrated employment. Competitive Integrated Employment (CIE) must satisfy three requirements: Competitive earnings, integrated locations, and opportunities for advancement. CIE may be part-time or full-time.

Preparing for Employment?

Pre-ETS (Employment and Transition Services) are available to all students with a disability beginning at age 14 through DARS. DARS (Department of Aging and Rehabilitative Services). You may contact DARS directly or you may work with the Transition Coordinator at your high school to apply for these services. These services include Job Exploration, Work Based Learning Experiences, Counseling on Post-Secondary Education and Training Opportunities, Workplace Readiness Training (these are small group sessions on social, communication, and professional skills) and Instruction in Self-Advocacy. Pre-ETS Services can be provided by DARS staff, approved Employment Service Organizations (ESOs) and other approved providers by DARS.

Once a student is ready for an independent job in the community, the student can apply to DARS for Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) Services.

What are Day Support/Community Integration Services?

These services should provide meaningful day activities. Activities are provided in small groups or one to one settings. These may include general community integration activities such as recreation and leisure, improving social skills, daily living skills, and volunteer experiences. Intensive services

are available for individuals who have a high level of daily living support needs throughout the day. Additional services may include Skilled Nursing, Behavior Support, Speech Therapy, and other Therapeutic Supports such as art therapy, expressive therapy, etc. Some day support centers may also offer self-employment opportunities where artisans are trained and sell craft items, jewelry, cards, etc.

What are Supported Employment Services?

Employment must take place in an integrated setting. Supported employment falls into two models: **Individual Supported Employment (ISE)** defined as intermittent support, usually provided one-on-one by a job coach who eventually fades out and the individual then relies on natural supports in the workplace. ISE includes job development, job placement, and job training. ISE also can include **Customized Employment** which is competitive integrated employment based on the individual employee's strengths and needs and is designed to meet the specific needs of an employer. It is employment developed through strategies that result in job responsibilities being customized and individually negotiated to fit the needs of individuals with a disability. **Group Supported Employment** is defined as continuous support provided by a job coach to 2-8 individuals with a local company or mobile work crew.

How are Employment & Day Support Services Paid?

The Community Service Boards and DARS (The Department of Aging and Rehabilitative Services) both contract with and coordinate with service providers to provide day and employment supports. Funding for these services are provided through local funds from the Community Services Boards in Alexandria, Arlington, and Fairfax OR by a Developmental Disabilities Medicaid Waiver OR by DARS. DARS provides funds for Pre-ETS and services for individuals who desire competitive and integrated employment in the community, whether full or part-time through their Vocational Rehabilitation Services. DARS provides short term services to obtain and maintain employment while CSBs and Medicaid Waivers fund long-term employment and day support services.

Self-Directed Services (available only through the Fairfax and Arlington Community Services Boards) are funds through the CSB that support an individual to create and maintain their own daily schedule. SDS vision is that individuals with ID/DD can access and actively participate in community-based activities they determine to be meaningful and beneficial. Services can occur in settings that are academic, educational, recreational, social, vocational, and volunteer. The CSB contracts directly with families and provides funds for them to purchase community-based support services of their choice for their family member.
